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Review of the Year

At the start of the year ringing sessions were held at Llanwern and at the feeding stations at Whitson and Porton, where small numbers of birds were trapped. A session held at the shelter-belt at Uskmouth in February was productive in that both Lesser Redpoll and Siskin were trapped. Ringing started in earnest however with the commencement of the CES breeding bird monitoring enquiry at Uskmouth, with nine visits being successfully completed during the season.

Nest boxes at Porton were monitored as part of our ongoing Tree Sparrow project and the colony reached an all-time productive high, with a minimum of 32 pulli fledging. Denny Island was visited in June and the Great Cormorant colony was considerably up on its poor showing in 2005. A welcome return of breeding Herring Gull was also noted and 3 juveniles were ringed, the first since 2000.

A part survey for Aquatic Warbler was undertaken at Uskmouth during August and an individual was trapped on 15th, the first since 2003. Significant numbers of Reed and Sedge Warbler were trapped during this time with record daily catches being made.

A total of 1,656 new birds of 39 species were ringed in the year. Of the new birds ringed, 246 were pulli – a significant increase on 2005 when 144 were ringed and reflecting the increase in nestboxes. A further 183 retrapped birds were processed. The Group's total catch, since it started some 12 years ago, is now just short of 14,150 birds. The number of species ringed was identical to 2005. With no new species being caught in the year, the total number of species ringed by the Group remains at 70.

Newport Wetlands Reserve

The site was first visited in February when ringing was undertaken in the main shelter-belt. This produced some 22 birds including 1 Lesser Redpoll and 11 Siskin, which were feeding on the ornamental alder.

Constant Effort Sites Scheme (CES)

Full participation in the British Trust for Ornithology's CES scheme was undertaken for the fourth successive year and 9 visits were completed successfully. During these, 362 captures were made involving 330 individual birds. Summary details of birds caught are shown in table 1.

Aquatic Warbler Project

A fifth consecutive year of this survey was undertaken, but only in part. Five early morning visits were made (instead of the usual 10) to Reedbed 8 starting on 9th and ending on 16th August. Despite the reduced number of visits the survey did produce an Aquatic Warbler on 15th August. Furthermore, Reed Warbler and Sedge Warbler were trapped in very good numbers. On the 9th August a new total for a daily catch was achieved with over 200 birds being trapped for the first time in the Group's history. Remarkably, this daily total of 220 birds was soon eclipsed when on the 14th August with 262 being trapped, including 143 Sedge Warbler and 104 Reed Warbler. Other reedbed species of note caught during the survey included: 2 Common Grasshopper Warbler; 13 Cetti's Warbler; and, just 2 Reed Bunting.

The total number of Cetti's Warbler trapped at Uskmouth during the year was 34 new birds with a further 11 retraps. Although numbers were down on 2005, it is more reflective of less ringing sessions being held rather than a reduction in the number of birds being present.

Open Days

We gave demonstrations of bird ringing on two dates in 2006: on 16th July as part of the Reserve's Open Day and then again on 1st October as part of the Gwent Ornithological Society's outdoor programme.

Hirundine Roost

There was a late summer hirundine roost at the Uskmouth reedbeds, but this was again small with just 100 birds being present on 25th July (60 Barn Swallow & 40 Sand Martin). An attempt to catch birds was made on this date, which resulted in 9 Barn Swallow and a single Sand Martin being trapped.

Autumn migrants

During August the Aquatic Survey was undertaken, which is reported elsewhere. Two ringing sessions were undertaken in both September and October. The September visits produced 100 birds on 9th and 67 on 16th and included 43 Blackcap. Ringing in October was severely hampered by poor weather conditions and only 19 birds were trapped. No further ringing took place after October.

Porton

Monitoring nest box use was the main focus of activity at Porton, although a single visit was made to the garden in January to trap birds at the winter feeding-station. This produced a modest catch of 18 birds, but no Tree Sparrow were present.

Tree Sparrow Project

After a poor year in 2005, when only 2 nest boxes were used and 1 brood fledged successfully, it was heartening that 2006 saw such a good recovery of the Tree Sparrow colony. At least 8 breeding pairs were present and a minimum of 32 juveniles fledged. The main breeding area is now at the Ireland Ground near Redwick where some 6 pairs were evident. The former stronghold near Porton House is still productive, but just 2 pairs were present.

Pill Farm, Whitson

Winter-feeding continued at the old orchard as part of the Gwent Tree Sparrow Project and the Group undertook a single ringing session here on 22nd January. No Tree Sparrows were seen during visits to the site in 2006.

Three of the new nest boxes were used and a part build nest was found in a fourth. A brood of Blue Tit was ringed, but a second Blue Tit brood and a brood of Great Tit

both fledged without being ringed. Barn Swallows nested in the outbuildings at the farm and two broods were ringed.

Llanwern

Just 2 standard ringing sessions were held at Llanwern, both during the start of the year. There was some excitement on the 15th January when a Firecrest bounced off a net, unfortunately it did not return for a second go! Two broods of Barn Swallow were ringed from a nest balanced on the top of a door in the porta-office. An unsuccessful attempt was made to catch Barn Swallows that were roosting in the reed fringes of the main pool where some 100 birds were present in late July.

The feral Greylag Geese were again breeding at the pool near the western security lodge. Eight adults and 17 juveniles were seen on 4th July, 17 of which were trapped and ringed/colour ringed. Sightings of colour ringed birds marked in June 2004 continued to be reported, details of which are set out below:

Great Cormorant Project

The Group visited Denny Island on 18th June and ringed 48 Great Cormorants, 14 of which were fitted with colour Darvic rings. The estimated number of occupied Great Cormorant nests was 17 (9 in 2005) and a further 55 nests had probably been used in the year (40 in 2005). The Estimated number of Great Cormorant adult/sub-adult fledged birds was 110 birds (150 being recorded in 2005). Three dead pulli were noted.

There was an estimated 60+ adult/sub-adult and 47 fledged juvenile Great Black-backed Gulls of which 27 pulli were ringed (40+ & 55 of which 8 were ringed in 2005). Herring Gulls were again found nesting on the island after a 3-year absence. A single nest was found and 3 juvenile birds were ringed. Rock Pipits were confirmed as breeding. The coverage of Tree Mallow on the island had decreased since 2005 with some 10% of the plateau having cover (75% in 2005), albeit fairly short at no more than 1 metre.

Ringing recoveries are shown in table 7 and sightings of colour-ringed birds are shown in table 8. There were more records from Gwent than in past years with 3 being found drowned at the fish cages at Llandegfedd Reservoir and a fourth bird being seen on several dates at Ynysyfro Reservoir between October and December. Slightly further afield, were the usual crop of sightings from around the Bristol reservoirs and the Cotswold Water Park. There were also several records from Hampshire, one of which being a bird shot as part of the Cormorant cull in England. Records from further north included birds being seen in Shropshire and Bolton.

Recoveries

Information on ringing recoveries received or relating to 2006 is shown in table 10 (see also table 7 for recoveries of Great Cormorants). Of interest amongst these are the following:

- Little Egret - the first significant movements of this species from its breeding site in Gwent;
- Great Black-backed Gull – the recovery of a bird in France is unusual in both distance from breeding site (a median distance of 115km is stated in Wernham *et al.* 2002) and location of recovery;
- Common Chiffchaff – British ringed birds are known to winter along most of their migration route from southern Britain but particularly in southern Portugal, Spain and Morocco (Wernham *et al.* 2002);

- Chaffinch – the timing of capture of this bird suggests that it might be an immigrant, possibly of Fennoscandia origin and possibly en route to Ireland, where the majority of female birds are known to winter (Wernham *et al.* 2002);
- Reed Bunting - predominantly a sedentary bird, but some directional autumn dispersal to milder areas has been noted (Wernham *et al.* 2002). This latest recovery is the second movement between Uskmouth and Lewell in Dorset, 100km to the south. An Uskmouth ringed bird was previously re-trapped in the winter at Newton Abbot, Devon, providing further evidence that some Gwent birds move south for the winter.
